The Bachelor of Fine Arts (Production) trains you to design, create, operate and manage in your chosen area of production. The program offers you three specialisations to choose from: Performance Technology, Stage Management and Design Realisation.

### Course Structure for Production

This specialisation requires the successful completion of 300 points taken over 36 months full time.

All subjects are 12.5 points unless otherwise specified.

VCA electives can be level 1/2/3 unless otherwise specified. These subjects can be taken from any discipline in the VCA that are open to interdisciplinary studies. There is a list at the bottom of each specialisation's handbook entry.
